- Study with peers from a diverse range of practitioner and cultural backgrounds.

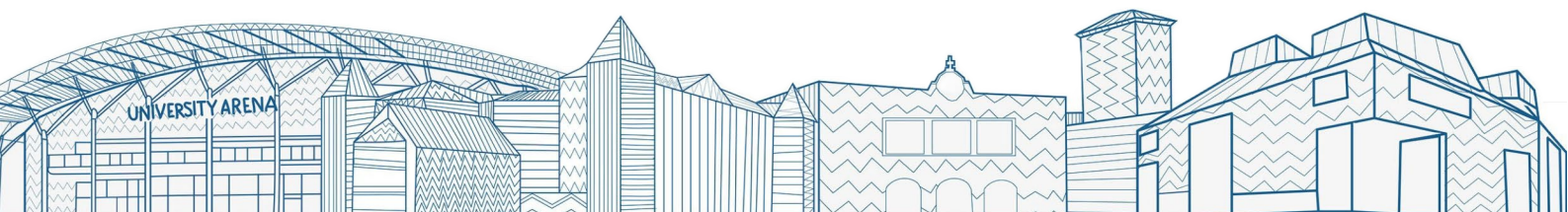
What do our previous students say about our postgraduate modules?

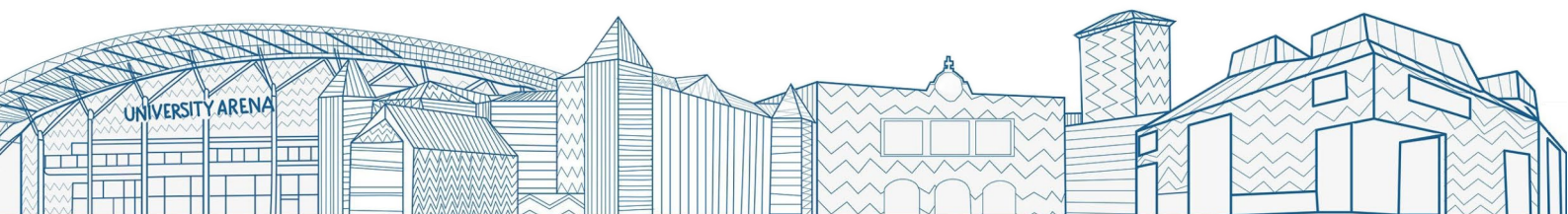
